



The stripper was applied to the bottom in less than 10 minutes with no wasted stripper. After 3 hours of dwell time, the bottom was scraped in 1.5 hours.

Process

- Step 1 Get a quart of paste
- Step 2 Test a one square foot area
- Step 3 Notice how it works
- Step 4 Practice the technique before doing a large area
- Step 5 Remember to apply the stripper **THICK** and let it **DWELL**

DOING YOUR PROJECT

1. Mask as necessary.
2. Apply Star 10 "Phase 1 Paste" at 70 square feet per gallon with a 1/2 gallon per minute airless paint sprayer using a .517 spray tip. You can also apply the "Phase 1 Paste" with a brush or roller. NOTE: You do not get an overspray effect when spray applying "Phase 1 Paste".
3. Clean your airless sprayer and tools with Star 10 "Phase 2 Liquid".
4. Let the "Phase 1 Paste" "dwell" for approximately half hour to four hours. The number of coats and type of paint dictate the "dwell" time.

HINT: Two things most people do wrong is they do not apply the "Phase 1 Paste" thick enough and they do not let it "dwell" long enough.
